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

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# Why eLearning?

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The introduction of e-learning in education and training represents a strategic goal for **UE**: key role in creating knowledge, new innovative learning and content services.

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**Padua University** offers a wide range of high quality distance learning online courses which promote excellent tutor-student and student-student interaction combined with ready access to online resources that are designed to facilitate part time flexible study and promote independent learning.

The courses are based on Moodle, a free, open-source PHP web application for producing modular internet-based courses.

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## **Profit from experience**

Padua University will offer her competence, experience and technology to design, develop and implement a comprehensive training programme in a virtual learning environment, as required by Linked Heritage, Task 7.2

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#### **UNIPD activities**:

gather training materials from different sources (i.e. sister projects, LH results, Europeana)

plan and develop Learning Objects and make them available through a VLE

special effort will be spent to help unskilful users to gain a basic knowledge on LH topics

an advanced set of modules taking into account the results of the project will also be delivered

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## **Target audience:**

 cultural institutions' managers and decisionmakers of Europeana potential content providers

- beginner-level LIS students

 culture and information specialists from museums, libraries and archives who need to keep up to date (self-education and lifelong learning)

- teachers

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All the training materials collected during the project and the LO developed will be hosted in and accessed through the University of Padua long-term preservation system Phaidra (Permanent Hosting and Archiving of Digital Assets and Resources), which is Europeana compliant.
