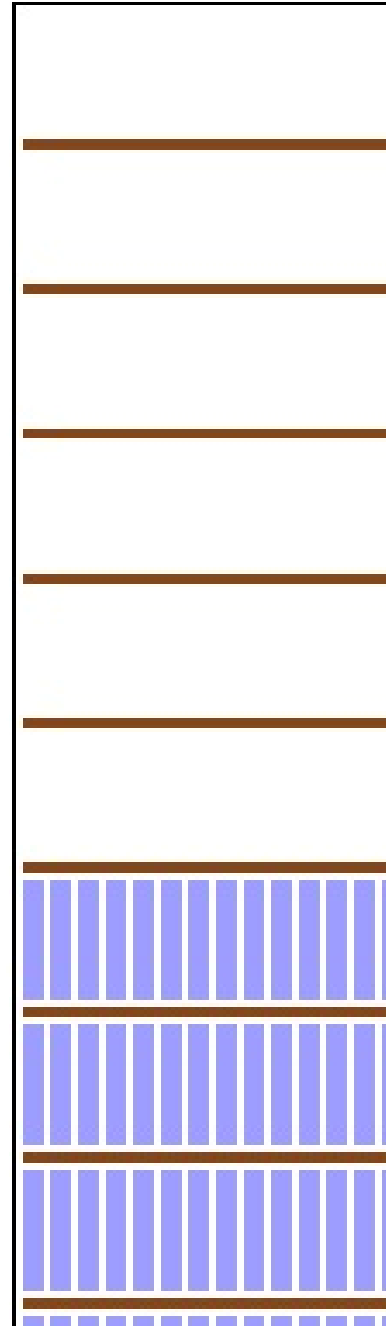

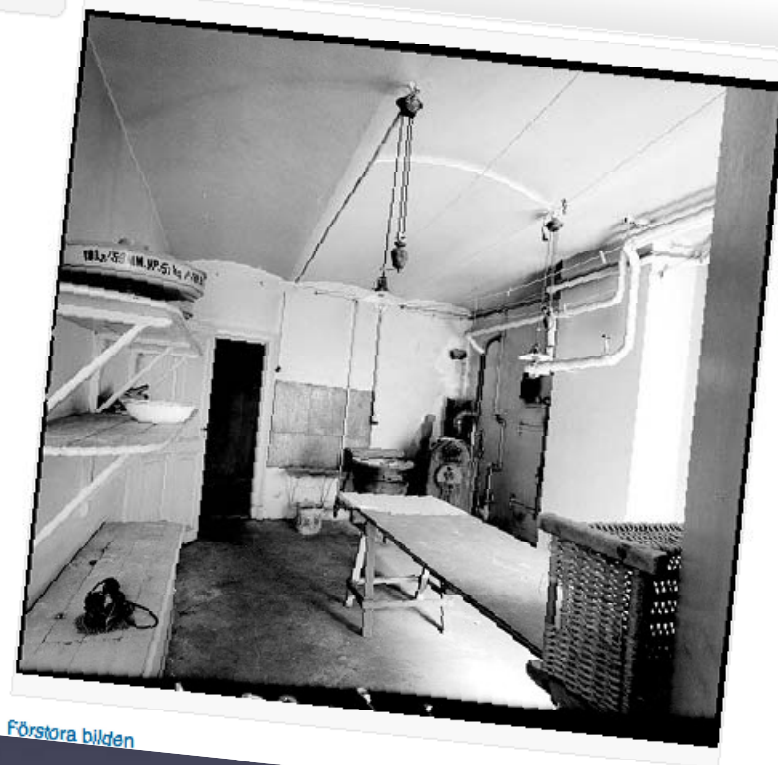

En **spinett** är ett lådformat enmanualigt klaverinstrument med klaviaturen placerat på resonanslådans långsida och med strängarna i spetsig vinkel mot klaviaturen vilket ger lådan dess vanligen ving- eller triangulära form. Det är nära släkt med [virginalen](#), och båda delar tonbildningssätt med [cembalon](#).

Spinetten var vanligt förekommande under 1500- och 1600-talen.

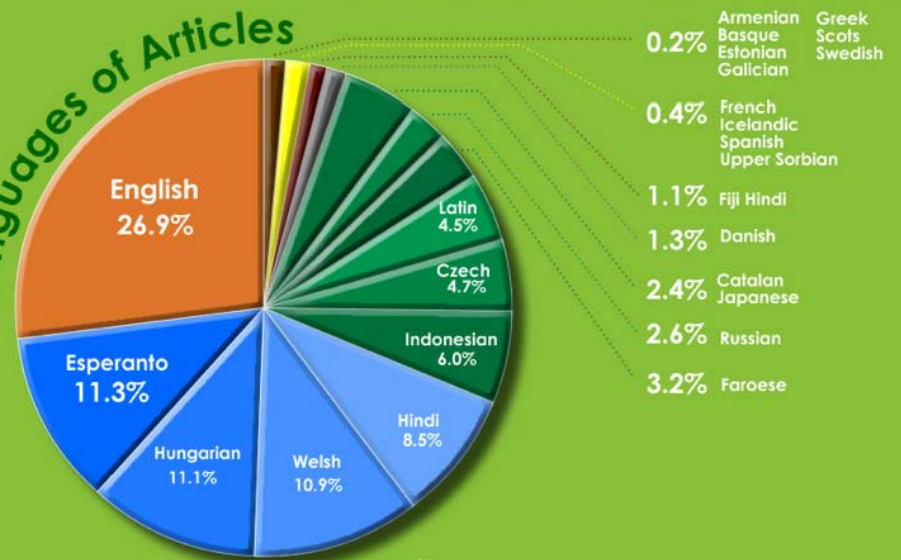
In 1417, Henry V, King of England, was here in 1386.

Stendhal syndrome, **Stendhal's syndrome**, **hyperkulturemia**, or **Florence syndrome** is a [psychosomatic illness](#) that causes rapid heartbeat, dizziness, fainting, confusion and even [hallucinations](#) when an individual is exposed to [art](#), usually when the art is particularly beautiful or a large amount of art is in a single place. The term can also be used to describe a similar reaction to a surfeit of choice in other circumstances, e.g. when confronted with immense beauty in the natural world.

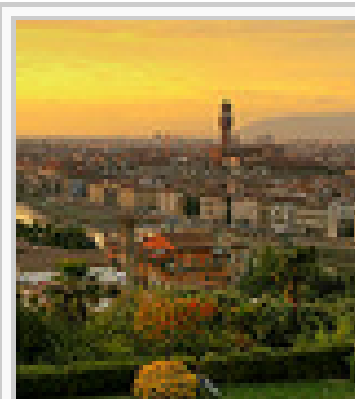
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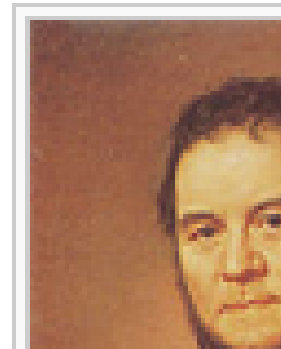
History

The illness is named after the famous 19th-century French author [Stendhal](#) (pseudonym of Henri-Marie Beyle), who described his experience with the phenomenon during his 1817 visit to [Florence](#) in his book *Naples and Florence: A Journey from Milan to Reggio*.

Although there are many descriptions of people becoming dizzy and fainting while taking in Florentine art, especially at the [Uffizi](#), dating from the early 19th century on, the syndrome was only named in 1979, when it was described by Italian psychiatrist [Graziella Magherini](#), who observed and described more than 100 similar cases among tourists and visitors in
